is the love which we can enjoy and in which we can rejoice. "I will be glad and rejoice in your unfailing love" (Psalm 37:7).





The Transformative Spirit

any believe that Christians must obey the Ten Commandments, and that the Holy Spirit imparts the willpower to do so. Commandments, and Jesus was not However the gift of the Holy Spirit is of far greater power and sent for a far higher purpose than that.

he Ten Commandments was a prescriptive law - a judicial system for an ungodly people, giving the Israelites a new identity based upon a national relationship with God. They were the centrepiece of the Old Covenant between God and Israel. They are called "the words of with heart, mind and soul, and to the Covenant" (Exodus 34:28). written on the "tables of the Covenant" (Deuteronomy 4:13,9:15), and kept in the "Ark of the Covenant" (1 Kings 8:9,21). The Ten Commandments did not make bad behaviour a sin. (Romans 5:12-13) Evil was always a sin. What they did was to make certain behaviour ILLEGAL, and subject to penalties for infringement!

hey also provided a basic L understanding of sin. stimulating a sense of guilt leading to repentance.

owever they were prescriptive laws, mostly negative, and all such laws have their limitations because they cannot cover every situation. There's no mention of insider dealings, substance abuse, racism or drink-driving. They are also prone to legalists finding loopholes, adding caveats and prioritising them as the Pharisees did. Also, people often become judgmental of others according to their own interpretation of them. Even keeping prescriptive laws is problematical. You can keep them by rote, or grudgingly by "working to rule", or even by going to bed and doing nothing!

esus' teachings about divorce, Uwealth and loving enemies shocked his disciples. Someone who said he'd always kept the Ten Commandments was told to sell all he had and follow him. (Matthew 19:9-25). These aren't in the Ten extrapolating FROM the Ten Commandments - that would be like saying "You should have read the small print".

esus appealed to higher spiritual principles from which the Ten Commandments were derived a superior law that is not just a list of dos and don'ts. The two great commandments to love God love neighbour as self are wholly positive, all-encompassing and pre-eminent above the Ten Commandments, not extrapolated from them - and there are no loopholes, caveats or let-out clauses! It is all about LOVE, its source and its focus.

I od's purpose was to start a J process which would lead to this: 1 Timothy 1:5 "the end (goal, objective) of the commandment is charity (love) out of a pure heart, a good conscience, and faith unfeigned". Jesus inaugurated a New Covenant with a people whom he called and filled with his Holy Spirit so that their hearts reflect his love. This New Covenant supercedes the prescriptive law of minimal standards designed for the ungodly. (Galatians 3:19,24-25; 5:14,18). By faith we embrace the superior principles of love for God and fellow man that far exceed it. (1 Tlmothy 1:9).

[•] his requires much more than just enhanced willpower. The Holy Spirit of God dwelling in us, together with our complicity and commitment, accomplishes within us a miraculous transformation. bringing our hearts "into sync" with the very nature of God, which is love. 2 Peter 1:2-8, Romans 8:1-14.29.

Sharing Jesus with Muslims in the NW of England

Our journey serving Jesus among Muslims has been a winding one.

In our twenties, God grew our heart for sharing the good news with unreached peoples. Exploring what this looks like has led us to Asia, where we spent 2 years studying and getting to know the people and the culture in that country. Then a global pandemic brought us back to the U.K. and a year of study at a bible college in Edinburgh. Then over the last 3 years God has placed Our day to day life feels guite us in a city in the NW of England, seeking to reach out to British South Muslim area of our city (90+%) and Asians.



We are so thankful for your ongoing support in many ways on this continuing adventure.

I (Pete) was a youth at Dumfries Baptist Church, and came to faith and was baptised there aged 11. Becky and I met through church while she was nursing and I was finishing my PhD in Earth Sciences. We realised we were both excited about serving God abroad. Now over a decade later God has blessed us with two primary aged children and we are living crossculturally in the U.K.

ordinary. We live in a predominantly we take our children to a local school. Pete works at a local community centre, and Becky does a bit of nursing. We try to make friends and get to know the people around us.

As part of this, Becky has been involved in a ladies' group in the community centre each Friday and is getting to know Mums and other ladies. Pete has got to know Dads and some of the men at the local mosques. God is using these relationships to give opportunities to have deeper spiritual conversations. to show people Jesus' love in practical ways and read the bible with a few friends.

Prayer Points:

- We'd love you to keep praying for these friendships, particularly for three extended family groups we know. We long to see God move in whole families to bring them to know Jesus, so they can support each other through the persecution that would likely follow.
- Please also pray for us, as the community centre Pete currently works at is closing in the summer. We are exploring starting a community focused business that we pray will give us new ways to serve and get to know people in our area of the city.

For the **SU prayer day in January**, we had an afternoon of prayer stations in the Avenue Rooms at DBC. There were a range of opportunities to pray, from scrabble letters to listening to worship music, which seemed to go down well with old and young supporters alike particularly popular were the Skittles prayers!



There have been many encouragements for the local SU volunteers over the last year.



There was a great response to the appeal for support for Owain Evans, our Regional Worker. From May to September 23, funding for the position rose from 60% to 98%. We are now looking to increase the number of the new D and G SUpport Squad by 25 people, giving as little as £1 a month, to build up a healthy regular giving for 100% of the costs of a full time SU worker.



In February there was a Secondary Weekend away at Barcaple and May saw the return of the Primary Weekend away at High Barbuchany near Newton Stewart.

Numbers of school groups in the region are still smaller than they were before the pandemic but are growing steadily. Speak to Jane Rafferty, Chris Dewhurst or Joseph Ellicott about the highs and lows of leading a group of young people through Bible teaching on a particular topic - not to mention relevant games or crafts - and talk to Owain Evans or any of the Action Group if you would like to explore the idea of helping in a local school either to run a group, volunteer as a helper or pray for what's going on in a particular school.

Treasurer's Report

Total Monthly Income

March 2024	£21,351
April 2024	£37,317

The following figures represent the first 83% of financial year 2023/24 with income 103% budget and expenditure 78% of budget. The total Income was £285,586 (£6420/week against a budget figure of £5400/week). Expenditure during this same period amounted to £217,725 (£5063/week against a budget figure of £5400/week) The income includes £12,462 for the "food parcel" ministry, which includes a grant and expenditure of £10,437 for this work, a great example of outreach to the community

We continue to notice the effects of increasing costs for many items but particularly gas, electricity and water rates. The Operating Company is particularly affected by rising food and staffing costs. We are also beginning to see some maintenance and replacement costs for the building being processed. However the general giving is well up on previous years due in part to the closure of the Appeal Fund.

If you already give regularly, or are considering doing so, and you pay income tax (as the vast majority of us do) you can "gift-aid" your offering which effectively means the church can claim an additional 25p for every £1 you give at no additional cost to you. So far in the current financial year over £35,000 of our offerings were **not** subject to Gift Aid. Please prayerfully consider whether you can Gift-Aid your giving. You can continue to give weekly, monthly or directly through your bank. Please contact me if you want further information regarding Gift-Aid.
